Jessica Vosk is a celebrated singer and actress known for electrifying roles on musical theater and concert stages. She made her Carnegie Hall debut in November 2021 in a sold-out solo show titled *My Golden Age*. Her 2022/23 season includes debuts at London's Cadogan Hall, Symphony Hall with Celebrity Series of Boston, and Washington Performing Arts. In June, she performs a new show at the 92nd Street Y as part of the Lyrics & Lyricists series: *California Dreamin'*, featuring music of the singer-songwriters of Laurel Canyon.

Best known for her star turn as Elphaba in the musical *Wicked*—first on tour and then joining the show's 15th anniversary on Broadway—Vosk played the green witch for two years. Earlier this year she joined the Atlantic Theater Company as Beth Ann in its production of Sarah Silverman's *The Bedwetter*. Vosk starred as the narrator in Lincoln Center's 50th anniversary performance of *Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat*, reprising the role last August at The Muny in St. Louis; created the role of Aunt Val in the world premiere of *Becoming Nancy* at Alliance Theatre in Atlanta, directed and choreographed by Jerry Mitchell; and became the first singer to star onstage with the New York City Ballet in *Something to Dance About*, the company's tribute to Jerome Robbins directed by Warren Carlyle. Vosk's other Broadway credits include Fruma Sarah in the most recent revival of *Fiddler on the Roof*, *Finding Neverland*, and *The Bridges of Madison County*.

She starred as Anita in San Francisco Symphony's Grammy-nominated production of *West Side Story* and filmed "The Leonard Bernstein Centennial Celebration at Tanglewood" with Michael Tilson Thomas for PBS's *Great Performances*. Her independently produced solo albums *Wild and Free* (2018) and *A Very Coco Christmas* (2020) both debuted on the Billboard and iTunes charts, and are available to stream on all platforms. Vosk had an unconventional journey to Broadway, beginning her career on Wall Street before taking the leap of faith to pursue her dreams on stage. Mary-Mitchell Campbell is a conductor, music director, orchestrator, composer, and arranger. She was most recently appointed Music Director of City Center Encores! and named an Imagination Artist and conductor for the Colorado Symphony. Her Broadway music director credits include *The Prom, Mean* Girls, My Love Letter to Broadway and For the Girls with Kristin Chenoweth, Tuck Everlasting, Finding Neverland, Big Fish, The Addams Family, Company (Drama Desk Award), Sweeney Todd, as well as music supervisor for Some Like It Hot. She has guest conducted the symphony orchestras of Chicago, Cincinnati, Dallas, and Nashville, among others. Her television credits include Homeschool Musical (HBO) and Girls5eva (Peacock). Ms. Campbell is the founder and president of Arts Ignite (formerly ASTEP, Artists Striving to End Poverty), which uses the arts to work with children in under-resourced communities. She is also a founding member of Musicians United for Social Equity (MUSE). A native of North Carolina, Ms. Campbell has taught as a member of the faculties of The Juilliard School, New York University, and Boston College.
