The **Wampanoag Nation Singers & Dancers** are musicians, educators, and artisans from the tribal communities of Mashpee on Cape Cod, Aquinnah on Martha's Vineyard, and Herring Pond in Bourne. The group's performances of eastern social songs and dances have both educated and entertained audiences of all ages in museums, schools, and various multi-cultural events. Dressed in traditional clothing, their songs are accompanied by a water drum and handcrafted rattles. Audience participation is encouraged—this group prefers to dance with the people instead of *for* the people.

The Wampanoag Nation Singers & Dancers have appeared at Jacob's Pillow, John F. Kennedy Presidential Library and Museum, the Peabody Essex Museum, Cambridge Arts Council, the Mary Baker Eddy Library, Heritage Museums & Gardens, Mashantucket Pequot Museum and Research Center, Mashpee Powwow, Aptucxet Trading Post Museum, Stonehill College, Brown University, and more.

They have toured throughout New England and as far away as Bermuda, Hawaii, and the UK. For three years, they have represented at the Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade, heading up the First Light Float and delivering the televised land acknowledgment.
